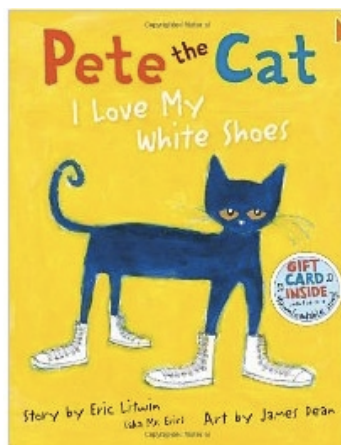


Be sure to also check out the following:
