As you read:

- 1) 4 post-its per chapter (see below for post it suggestions/guidelines)
- 2) No spoilers! If you choose to read ahead, that's okay, but you must continue to jot and not give anything away.
- 3) We will read some nonfiction companion texts
- 4) We will complete some mini projects (see calendar)
- 5) You will have choice for how you read (see below)
- 6) Any reading not finished in school will be completed at home
- 7) You will continue to read your independent book!!!

After we finish the book:

- 1) We will re-read selected passages to analyze
- 2) We will have a class discussion
- 3) We will complete writing based on our discussions

Choices for reading:

- 1) Read and jot independently(conferences with teacher)
- 2) Read with a partner you can read aloud or read separately and then meet at the end of each chapter to discuss confusing parts, plot, etc.
- 3) Read in a small group with a teacher
- 4) Listen to the text on audio (you must have headphones with you)

Where Can I Stop and Jot?

- 1)Contrasts or contradictions- When a character acts in a way that you don't expect (out of character) **Why are they acting like this?**
- 2) Again and Again you notice that a detail is repeated (an object, a place, a phrase). What could it mean?
- 3)Memory moments(aka Flashback) The plot stops moving forward and flashes back to something in the past. **Why is this important?**
- 4)Tough questions- The protagonists asks themselves tough questions about their situation or make a decision to make a change in their situation. **What are they learning?**
- 5)Aha moment- You've figured something out OR the protagonist realizes something. What might change now?
- 6)Questions When you are confused about a detail or part OR you are wondering something

***When you stop and jot, you can stop along the way to jot OR you can leave blank post-its at places where you will stop and jot and return at the end of the chapter
